What is NYLT?

NYLT is a week-long experience based on the activities of a typical unit during a month of program. The course is a combination of classroom and practical exercises, all taught by a youth staff, modeling the best in leadership skills, using the teaching E.D.G.E. The course is about **vision-based team building with a wide variety of fun and challenging activities.**

Who May Attend NYLT?

This course is a co-ed course open to Boy Scouts and Venture Crew Members. Scoutmasters and Crew Advisors select and nominate the participants who may attend NYLT, sending those who currently or will

soon hold key leadership positions in the Unit. Scouts attending must be at least 13 years old by the first day of the course and have obtained the rank of First Class (no exceptions). Crew Members must have attended VLSC or ILSC. Nominees should have completed the Unit's own Leadership Training experience and have had at least one leadership position within the Unit.

June 24th through 30th, 2012 at Camp Thunderbird

WHAT IS THE COST & PAYMENT SCHEDULE?

The fee of \$220.00 covers the cost of food, facility, program supplies, insurance, patch, cap, training materials, and one (1) course T-shirt (Additional T-shirts may be ordered). Personal camping gear and materials are to be supplied by each individual Scout. Full payment for the six-day experience must be made by June 1, 2012.

To the Scoutmasters in Pacific Harbors Council,

As you are looking forward to another great year of Scouting with your troop I encourage you to consider sending your future troop leaders to the 2012 National Youth Leadership Training (formerly known as Bushmaster). The course dates are June 24th through June 30th, 2012 -- a full week of camping, leader training, scout skills and FUN! This year's training will be held at beautiful Camp Thunderbird near Olympia.

The National Youth Leadership Training is a full month of Troop meetings and activities compressed into one week. Scouts will have a chance to polish their scout skills such as lashing, knots, cooking and cleaning, etc. They will also be working together to create a campfire program that they can bring back to your unit. Scouts will be divided into patrols with participants from units all over Pacific Harbors Council. This will enable them to build lasting friendships with Scouts throughout the Council. Scouts will also be given opportunities to work on developing the skills needed to problem-solve challenges. There will be some "seat time" as presentations are made by the youth staff using PowerPoint slides and movies to enhance the teaching and learning of new leadership skills.

Your job is to find your unit's FUTURE youth leadership and interview him (or them) for this exciting training program. The N.Y.L.T. conference is built to complement your unit's troop leadership training, *not replace it*. Minimum requirements are the Scout must have achieved the rank of First Class, be 13 years old and have completed grade 7 by the time the course starts. The application has three sections to fill out. The first section is for the Scout and parent(s), the registration form, sign the code of conduct statement and the health statement. The next section is for you, the Scoutmaster, to fill in the information on the Scout's skills as you have observed them and sign the statement. The last section is a questionnaire for the Scout to fill out about himself and how he feels about his own skills.
